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Client Consent for Services

Ownership Verification:

I acknowledge that I am at least 18 years of age, and I am the legal owner, and/or I am the responsible party for the services selected/not selected for my pet(s). I hereby give my consent to proceed with the recommended vaccinations, test and antiparasitics for my pet(s).

Vaccination Information:

I understand that the vaccinations and parasiticides will substantially reduce, but may not completely eliminate, my pet's chances of contracting or controlling the illnesses or parasites we are trying to prevent.

Possible Side Effects:

I understand that my pet may develop side effects after vaccination and/or administration of parasiticides and that these side effects are usually minor and resolve without need for additional veterinary care. I understand that should my pet develop any severe reaction or any behavioral/symptom that is of concern to me, emergency veterinary care may be necessary and it is my financial responsibility to seek care at the nearest veterinary facility.

It is common for pets to experience some or all of the following mild side effects after receiving a vaccine, usually starting within hours of the vaccination. If these side effects last for more than a day or two, or cause your pet significant discomfort, it is important for you to contact your primary care veterinarian:

- Discomfort and local swelling at the vaccination site
- Mild fever
- Decreased appetite and activity
- A small, firm swelling under the skin may develop at the site of a recent vaccination. It should start to disappear within a couple weeks. If it persists more than three weeks, or seems to be getting larger, you should contact your veterinarian.

More serious, but less common side effects, such as allergic reactions, may occur within minutes to hours after vaccination. These reactions can be life-threatening and are medical emergencies. Seek veterinary care *immediately* at a local animal emergency hospital if any of these signs develop:

- Persistent vomiting or diarrhea
- Itchy skin that may seem bumpy ("hives")
- Swelling of the muzzle and around the face, neck, or eyes
- Severe coughing or difficulty breathing
- Collapse
- If your pet is known to have an adverse vaccine reaction it is your responsibility to notify the veterinarian BEFORE the vaccine is administered

CATS ONLY: Malignant Cancer at Injection Site:

I understand that in addition to the side effects described above, following the administration of any vaccination (or any needle insertion into the skin for any reasons including microchip insertion, fluid administration, etc.) that my cat may develop an aggressive, malignant cancer at the injection site. I understand that if my cat develops this cancer all veterinary costs incurred for the diagnosis and treatment are at my expense.

Heartworm Testing and Prevention:

Your dog's heartworm test results are valid for 30 days. Prevention must be started or continued within that time. Annual testing is required to be able to purchase heartworm prevention products. I understand that I can purchase heartworm prevention products through our online pet pharmacy (VetSource), or the pharmacy of my choice with a written prescription. I agree that I will not give heartworm prevention without a negative test result. Failure to give, or missing a dose may result in requiring an additional negative heartworm test result in order to continue.

Written Prescriptions:

In order to ensure appropriate dosing and safety/efficacy of products it is strongly recommended to use our online pet pharmacy (VetSource) for all of your pet's prescription needs. However, a written prescription for any prescription product is available upon your request.

Acceptance of Risk:

To the best of my knowledge, I confirm that my pet has no sign of disease, is not allergic to vaccines or parasiticides and is not pregnant. I have read and understand all the provisions as well as the listed possible reactions, and I have had the chance to ask any and all questions that I have regarding the risks associated with vaccinations and parasiticides that have been recommended for my pet based on a discussion of my pet's lifestyle and risk.

I agree to accept all risks of vaccinations and parasiticides and accept the legal and financial responsibility for all charges incurred as a result of such risks. I further acknowledge that Double H Veterinary Services, LLC, or any of their veterinarians, owners, subcontractors, staff, volunteers, or any other individuals or entities associated therewith, will not bear any legal or financial responsibility for such risks that will not bear any legal or financial responsibility for any charges or losses incurred by me.
