



Pet Treatment Sheet

- Do you ever lose track of your pets' medication in their treatment plan?
- Do you have multiple pets and forget who gets what medicine?
- Have you ever forgotten or perhaps double-dosed your pet because there are multiple people in charge of caring for them?
- Are you going on vacation and want to make sure your pet sitter doesn't miss an important medication dose?

If you answered "Yes" to any of these questions then this Pet Treatment Sheet may be for you!

It is simple and easy to use no matter how many pets or medications you may have. It's as easy as 1-2-3!

For a single pet household who may be on one or more medications by your primary care veterinarian:

1. Write in the medication prescribed and the dosing instructions in the Medication box down the side of the sheet.
2. Complete the Date line along the top and highlight the corresponding days with the dosing instructions (ie. Once a day, twice a day, three times a day).
3. Mark the highlighted spot once the medication has been completed for that day/time with either an initial, check mark, "x" or other identifying marker to indicate it has been completed.

For a multi-pet household who may be on one or more medications by your primary care veterinarian:

1. Write in the Pet's Name and medication prescribed along with the dosing instructions in the Medication box down the side of the sheet.
2. Complete the Date line along the top and highlight the corresponding days with the dosing instructions (ie. Once a day, twice a day, three times a day). TIP: If possible, it is recommended to color coordinate a specific color with a specific pet and all of their medications.
3. Mark the highlighted spot once the medication has been completed for that day/time with either an initial, check mark, "x" or other identifying marker to indicate it has been completed.

For a litter of puppies or kittens who may be on the same medication by your primary care veterinarian: it is recommended to use the Litter Treatment Sheet form. Be sure to write the specific medication name at the top on the line provided so there is no confusion on what they get.

1. Write in the pet's collar color and medication dose in the Medication box down the side of the sheet.
2. Complete the Date line along the top and highlight the corresponding days with the dosing instructions (ie. Once a day, twice a day, three times a day).
3. Mark the highlighted spot once the medication has been completed for that day/time with either an initial, check mark, "x" or other identifying marker to indicate it has been completed.
